



Built of timber and thatch as a minimum impact development inside the national park, Nehimba is centrally located in northern Hwange. The lodge is designed around a waterhole that provides mineral-rich water favored by wildlife, and especially elephants from many miles around; in the dry season, guests need go no further than their room veranda for an amazing wildlife spectacle.



## Location

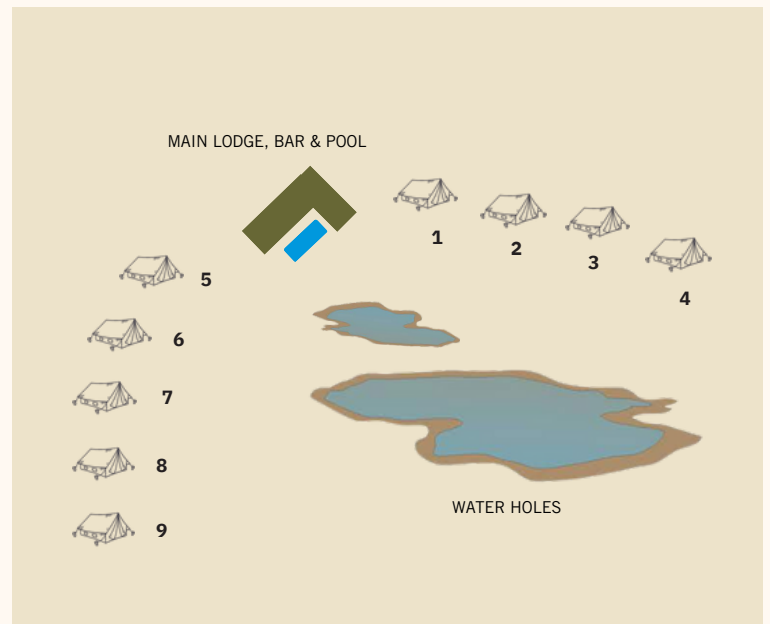
Situated on a massive 175 sq km private concession in northern Hwange National Park. Lodge co-ordinates are: South 18 52 27.76 / East 026 29 03.02.

### BY ROAD

Five hours by road from Victoria Falls. Distances Victoria Falls – Dete Station 160 km and 50 km 4x4 through the park. Distances Victoria Falls – Main Camp 185 km and 60 km through the park (4x4 not necessary). Five hours by road from Bulawayo. Distances Bulawayo – Main Camp 285 km and 60 km through the park (4x4 not necessary).

### BY AIR

Forty minutes by light aircraft from Victoria Falls; one hour twenty minutes from Bulawayo. Shumba Airstrip – South 18 50 54.88 / East 026 21 35.41 – gravel surface; open all year but please check local conditions. Road transfer to camp 10 minutes.



## Accommodation

2 x Family Rooms: 60 sq m under thatch on a raised deck overlooking the waterhole with one kingsize and two  $\frac{3}{4}$  beds, ensuite bathroom with free-standing bath, outdoor shower.

1 x Double Room with daybed: 60 sq m under thatch on a raised deck overlooking the waterhole with one kingsize bed and a daybed, ensuite bathroom with free-standing bath, outdoor shower.

3 x Double Rooms: 60 sq m under thatch on a raised deck overlooking the waterhole, each with one kingsize bed, ensuite bathroom with free-standing bath, outdoor shower.

2 x Twin Rooms: 50 sq m under thatch on a raised deck overlooking the waterhole with two  $\frac{3}{4}$  beds, ensuite bathroom with free-standing bath, outdoor shower.

1 x Twin Room: 40 sq m under thatch on a raised deck overlooking the waterhole with two  $\frac{3}{4}$  beds, ensuite bathroom with free-standing bath, outdoor shower.



# Activities

Our guides are among the best in the business and are regularly featured by name in guest feedback. Guides will discuss options for activities with guests the night before, and will always be keen to provide the best possible combinations of variety and experience. Activities are taken in open 4x4 vehicles specially adapted for unimpeded photography.

**Morning and afternoon game drives** – timing will vary with the season and sightings of special interest. **Full-day game drives** – a longer excursion into the park with a picnic lunch in a shady place and a leisurely drive back to the lodge in the late afternoon. **Night drives** are taken on our private concession in search of the nocturnal species of the park. **Game walks** will be taken by an experienced guide for a more intimate experience of the signs, sounds and scents of the bush. **Places of Interest** – not far from the lodge is the Nehimba Seeps, a site of special conservation interest where once the San hunter-gatherers used holes excavated by elephants to find water during the dry season. More distant is the scenic Masuma Dam with its resident pod of hippos.

# Facilities & Amenities

The main lodge comprises a dining room, lounge and bar areas under thatch on a raised teak deck, open-sided with views over the waterhole. Dinner is often enjoyed alfresco on the patio in front of the main building with elephants drinking metres away. Fully solar powered; free wifi service. Plunge pool in front of the main lodge. All rooms have ceiling fans, electronic safe, mosquito nets, free daily laundry service.

# Children

Children under the age of 7 are only allowed by special arrangement and providing parents sign a disclaimer. This is subject to restrictions, particularly with private dining options and a separate vehicle for game drives and is at the sole discretion of lodge management. Children aged 12 and below pay 30% on the accommodation portion only and must share with an adult. Up to 2 children may share a tent with an adult.
